I had a most enjoyable day at the well organised Northern Boxer Club Show at the wonderful venue My Pet Stop, Leeds. I am pleased to say that there were several dogs which I would have been happy to award the C.C. too, several from the lower classes which is always a good sign for the future.

Minor Puppy Dog (11)

1. Bruggenburg-Rothschild's Merribox Starting With Me a well balanced youngster with an excellent head, tight dark eyes and correct chin. Lovely neck & shoulder, short back, good body and topline, well angulated hindquarters, just needs to come up on his feet to complete the picture.
2. Box & Turner's Boxken Bonkers, well balanced head with wide under jaw but would prefer more chin, good neck & shoulder, Short back and good topline, strong hindquarters ,just needs time to come up on his feet and settle in front movement. Very well handled.
3. Miller's Walkon Bob The Builder

Puppy Dog (7)

1. Mair's Star Attraction at Glenauld, Difficult decision between 1st & 2nd, the winner scored in movement with his long easy stride and good outline. Typical head with well padded muzzle, broad under jaw and dark eyes. Excellent neck & shoulder, good body and forechest, well angulated hindquarters which he used well. Best Puppy in Show
2. Banks' Sunhawk Norwatch Sensation very promising puppy with lovely head and expression, good body and forechest, well angulated hindquarters, lovely outline when posed just needs time to settle on the move. Will have a bright future.
3. Jones' Tyberg Warrior.

Junior Dog (18)

1. Huckerby's Norwilbeck Designed in Time, very promising young red/white, typical head with well padded muzzle & dark expressive eyes, needs a little more chin to complete the picture. Good neck and shoulder, short back, good topline and strong hindquarters, covers the ground well on the move keeping a lovely outline, just needs more time to mature.
2. Groves & Hare's Jimbren Drunk N Dribblin, Well balanced head with good muzzle and correct chin, slightly sore eyes today which took away from his expression. Lovely bone and feet, short back, good topline & hindquarters, carries himself very well on the move.
3. Carter's Alf Abbett at Susancar.

Yearling Dog (15)

1. Groves & Hare's Verileas Dancing Deano to Jimbren, typical head with wide well padded muzzle just needs a little more chin, dark expressive eyes, good neck and shoulder with good forechest and excellent bone and feet. Good topline and hindquarters, scored in length of leg over 2nd.
2. Banks' Newsnight at Sunhawk Norwatch, well balanced head with well padded muzzle & dark eyes, excellent neck and shoulder, short back good topline and hindquarters, really covers the ground well on the move.
3. Chippendale's More Mayhem for Mylicam.

Novice Dog (7)

1. Ward-Davies, Hutchings & Brown's Lichdel Uncle Silas to Winwuwuk, such a classy, elegant dog with his lovely head, dark expressive eyes and good lip placement, long crested neck, good bone and feet, good topline and hindquarters. Moved really well with a free effortless stride and good outline, just needs a little more time to trouble the best.
2. Mairs' Glenauld Gervais, well balanced head with clean skull, good muzzle and correct chin. Good neck and shoulder, good body and topline, well angulated hindquarters, could be a little more positive on the move.
3. Preece & Cooper's Sonshoby Red Alert to Boxwold.

Debutant Dog (8)

1. Carter's Shaw Bett for Susancar, tall, elegant dog with clean head and correct chin but needs a little more work in his muzzle, dark eyes, good neck & shoulder, good body and topline, free easy mover.
2. Drinkwater's Sulez Backtoblack. Lovely head and expression, good neck and shoulder, lovely bone and feet, short back and good hindquarters. Super outline when posed but tended to drop a little on the move which lost him the class.
3. Mc Donald's Yeteb Law N Order.

Graduate Dog (3)

1. Blackley's Faerdorn Illusionist at Sunhawk Norwatch, well balanced head with well padded muzzle, dark eyes a little round and would prefer softer expression, good reach of neck, short back and good topline, strong hindquarters which he used well on the move.
2. Barrand & Royle's Newlaithe Raise My Game at for Siacybox, typical head with dark eyes but would prefer more chin, good bone and feet, good neck and shoulder, short back and good topline, very well muscled hindquarters which he used well on the move.
3. Wragg's Harmaur Hoodlums Trade.

Postgraduate Dog (12)

1. Tucker, Moncur-Drysdale's Abythorn All Wrapped Up fro Carmondene, most impressive dog with clean skull, well padded muzzle and dark expressive eyes. Lovely neck and shoulder, short back, good topline and hindquarters, moves with great drive keeping a wonderful outline, just needs to settle down a little on the move. Res. C.C.
2. Mair's Alcomar's The Designer at Glenauld, typical head with well padded muzzle, correct chin but a little heavy in skull. Good reach of neck and well laid shoulders, short back & good topline, strong hindquarters which he uses well on the move keeping a lovely outline.
3. Flintoff's Boxania Hot N Spicy.

Limit Dog (12)

1. Wardle & Clarke's Haygina Prince Charming, most impressive dog with a wonderful outline, typical head with dark expressive eyes and well padded muzzle, long crested neck, good forechest and layback of shoulder, short back good topline and hindquarters, could be better in front movement but goes with great drive keeping his lovely outline.
2. Mair's Sunkap Spellminder at Glenauld, well balanced head with clean skull, correct chin and dark eyes. Good neck and shoulder, short back, good topline and well angulated hindquarters, moves soundly but can flatten his topline sometimes on the move.
3. Woods' Sandyne Soul Mate.

Open Dog (11)

1. Ward-Davies, Brown and Hutchings' Ch. Winuwuk Lust At First Sight, not a very eye-catching dog but the more you look at him, the more you appreciate him, he is such an honest dog, so well balanced with no exaggeration. Clean head with wide ,well padded muzzle and dark expressive eyes, good neck and shoulder , good body and topline, strong hindquarters, must be one of the soundest dogs here today, shown in optimum condition and well handled to make the most of himself. 2. Miller's Ch. Walkon Made N Issue, tall impressive dog with excellent bone and substance, typical head with well padded muzzle, dark eyes and correct chin. Good reach of neck and well laid shoulders, good body and topline, strong, well muscled hindquarters, a little erratic in his rear movement today, but liked his long free easy stride which looked as if he could keep going for a long time!
3. Pynegar's Ch. Berwynfa Bulletproof JW.

Veteran Dog (2)

1. Box & Turner's Ch. Boxken Bottle A Beer, a dog I remember well from his heyday and he is still looking very well! Lovely head and expression, wide mouth, clean skull and good lip placement. Lovely neck and shoulder, short back, good topline & hindquarters, lovely bone and feet. Very sound on the move, keeping his nice outline.
2. Clayforth's Tyslee Twist of Fate, another in excellent condition, typical head with well padded muzzle and dark eyes. Long crested neck, good body and topline, strong hindquarters, very nice outline on the move.
