Once again my co-judge was Sandra Parle, a clever no nonsense Boxer woman, always a pleasure to judge with and we had no difficulty arriving at our joint decisions and the services of Referee Paul Stinton were not required.

BIS went to Miss C. Schofield's new homebred champion on the day, **Koppernox Mickey Finn**, **RBIS** Beardsell & Van-Beck's **Galicar Designed for Looks by Newlaithe**, **BP** Pynegar's **Berwynfa Bullet Proof**.

MPB (21.5)

1) Pyngar's Berwynfa Doll-Daga Buzz-Buzz, pleasing balanced outline, dark expressive eyes, clean arched neck, high set tail, nicely angulated rear, broad thighs, progressing nicely for age, short glossy coat

2) Bell & Beardrow's Belvern Pure Majic, typical outline with a good degree of elegance, well set neck, good legs and feet, not yet so far on in body as winner, shows much promise.

3) Bagnall's Soojon Contradiction

PB (23.1)

1) Poole & Barlett's Sonshoby Steal The Deal at Bartains, feminine, classy balanced outlook, developing nicely in chest, ribs and body, good legs and feet,, willing showgirl learning the job well, an excellent prospect. BPB

2) Lay & Clarkes' Swiftwood Summer Time Blues, nicely combines substance and quality, good conformation and depth of brisket, used herself well when moving, close up to winner, if maturity is kind should have an interesting future.

3) Beardsell & Van-beck's Newlaithe Hot Heels

JB (15.2)

1) Cunningham's Hamlear Hail To Glory, striking outline, good type and quality, pleasing head eye and expression, impressive overall outline and balance, deep chest, nicely angulated front and rear, well up at wither, firm slightly sloping topline, when settled moved with excellent carriage and a good stride with plenty of drive from well made hindquarters.

2) Mair's Diamond Lottery at Glenauld JW, balanced outline, attractive head type, good fore chest, well rounded ribs, handled to advantage, in excellent bloom.

3) Price's Bailiga Without Doubt

YB (8.0)

1) Carter's Susancar Natalie Dressed JW, attractive type, pleasing head pattern, clean neck of good length, defined withers, straight well boned forearms, deep enough in chest,, well rounded ribs, broad muscular thighs, moved with purpose.

2) Green's Shiloh Painted Lady for Honeybox JW, first class breed type and quality, good head, neck, topline and tail set, ribs and body handled well, superb coat and condition, pressed winner all the way in this strongly contested class.

3) Pynegar's Berwynfa Sugar Babe JW

NB (14. 3)

1) Huckerby & Dowell's Bellchime Special Edition, sharp, nicely proportioned outline, most attractive head, eye and expression, lengthy crested neck, 17 months old and approaching maturity well, when settled moved with style and purpose.

2) Groves & Hare's Jimbren Tea Total, same age as winner well constructed and lacked nothing in type and quality with only small things to separate her from winner.

3) Brooks' Jinnybrux Just Suppose.

DB (9.3)

- 1) Peck's Enesha Mamma Mia, bright character, typical outlook, squarely built, pleasing head and expression, deep brisket, good legs and feet, well schooled yearling who made the most of herself, at all times, well presented smooth glossy coat, good on the move.
- 2) McDonald's Yeteb Seventh Heaven, balanced junior, nice neck, strong topline, well off for bone, not as far on as winner in ribs and body, performed with style and confidence.
- 3) Marshall-Curtis' Santarra In A spin At Marcurt.

GB (12. 2)

- 1) Beardsell & Van-beck's Galicar Designed for Looks by Newlaithe, balanced, squarely built, feminine, yearling, full of breed type and quality, attractive head eye and expression, fine ears correctly placed and carried, well set lengthy crested neck, good shoulder, upper arm and forechest, nicely boned straight forearms, strong gently sloping back, good buttocks and rear angulation with low hocks, effortless, ground covering, driving gait, first class attitude and carriage, in best coat and condition. CC, with my co-judges agreement RBIS.
- 2) Woolliss' Jinnybrux Just A Hint at Rameleon, pleasing size, attractive eye and expression, good bone and substance, nicely angulated front and rear, at her best on the move showing a powerful driving gait.
- 3) Clayforth's Tyslee Cover girl

PGB (10. 1)

- 1) Mairs' Alcomar's Designer Label at Glenauld JW, gave nothing away in type and quality, square build, attractive head, eye and expression, firm topline, high set tail, well bodied good legs and feet, cleverly handled to maximise her virtues, in the peak of condition.
- 2) Taylor's Wilmarc Blue Monday, typical outlook, good head pattern, adequate well set neck, strong body and bone, soundly constructed, well let down hocks, moved as expected. Close up to winner.
- 3) Green's Darrak Ruby's Song for Honeybox

LB (19.)

- 1) Lay's Swiftwood Summer Shades, 3 years old with all of the attributes that maturity brings, nicely combines type, substance and soundness, good chest, ribs and body, strongly boned straight forearms, broad thighs, well muscled up throughout,, in fine condition, handled and showing to best advantage.
- 2) Cairn's Galicar Indecision, admirably proportioned balanced outline, clean crested neck, firm slightly sloping topline, nicely angulated front and rear enabling a lengthy stride and powerful drive, 22 months old and needing a little more development in rib and body, carried herself with nobility and style.
- 3) Greenall's Theoben Show lass at Manolta

OB (8.1)

- 1) Griffiths' Belvern Bellisamia at Lanfrese, first class conformation, head well carried on lengthy arched neck, nicely rounded ribs, firm, sloping broad back, short loins, straight strongly boned forelegs, strong well angulated muscular hindquarters, neat feet , retained a good outline standing and moving, long striding free gait, in best coat and condition, handled to best advantage. - 2) Mair's CH Faerdorn Designed for Glenauld JW ShCM, squarely built with impressive lines and proportions, further enhanced by her smooth tight, glossy coat, which combine to give immediate eye appeal, upon closer examination she didn't disappoint but her movement could have been more harmonious which pegged her back today.
- 3) Miller's CH Razzle Dazzle for Walkon

VB (7.3)

- 1) Wood's Sandyne Line dance JW , lovely type outline and balance, in good form, did everything right and moved out well to take this strongly contested class.
- 2) Rushton's Walkon Frangipani to Davnette, 10 years old, impressive outline and balance, in firm condition, co-operated well with her handler, a great credit to her owner close up.
