Boxer Bitches

Thank you to the committee, my two stewards and the lovely bitches I had the pleasure of judging. I was delighted to find top quality in every class. However this did mean that some lovely bitches went cardless and my placings were in most cases split by a whisker. I know we have some problems with poor mouths, lip placement, movement etc but overall the quality of the bitches was high and I was more than pleased with my final line up.

BIS Ch Sandcliffe Snog in the Fog at Jimbren. RBIS Roamaro Razzle Dazzle for Walkon. BPIS Lichdel Lets Boogie (On the referees decision)

MPB 18 (2abs)

1st - Breakspear's Pendance Perdecta at Porth - very promising B/W of almost 8 mths. Well grown balanced baby with good front on excellent tight feet. Head most appealing with a broad well padded muzzle of good depth with clean skull and flat cheeks. Moved well and showed with a lot of assurance.

2nd - Scott's Glenauld Touch of Design at Rudino - I liked this youngster very much. She has many of the qualities I found in my winner being of similar make and shape also possessing a well balanced head The winner was slightly shorter in back.

3rd - Chippendale's Maid to Mingle with Mylicam

PB 13 (2abs)

1st - Carter's Susancar Natalie Dressed - R/W who reminded me in many ways of her lovely mum who I gave a Res CC to as a youngster. She is a typical example of substance with elegance with excellent proportions throughout, presenting a balanced flowing outline. She moved effortlessly around the ring keeping her lovely shape. Super head type with an excellent rise of skull. Good stop and blocky muzzle. With a little more maturity will be picking up green cards. **BPB**

2nd - Mair's Glenauld Designer Reality - R/W giving a good deal away to age and maturity. I really liked her head with its good balance of muzzle to skull ratio. Well shaped dark eyes, good mouth and lip placement. Presents a square compact outline with good brisket depth. Preferred rear angulation of 1.

3rd - Portlock's Harmaur Gold Diggers Trade at Sheiken

JB 12 (2abs)

1st - Miller's Roamaro Razzle Dazzle for Walkon - Super dark B/W with a clean flowing outline. Long arched neck, good depth of brisket with clean tuck up and good angulations. However it was her beautiful head that hooked me. It is well balanced from all angles, excellent muzzle and finish to foreface with a good rise of skull, clean with no excessive wrinkling. Good mouth and lip placement, dark eyes giving an alert yet so feminine expression. I know she has more maturing to do but could not deny her the CC. I am sure her 3rd will not be too far away.

2nd - Bank's Norwatch Sunhawk Make a Wish - Another beautiful B/W with lovely round bone. Soundly constructed of correct proportions. Really good head type with excellent width and depth of muzzle. Clean skull with good rise. Correct shaped dark eyes. Moved well keeping a level topline.

3rd - Archibald's Theoben Class Act

YB 11 (1 abs)

1st - Robey's Mindenwood Incantation - B/W of the highest quality. Combines substance with elegance to produce a classic outline. Good length of neck, correct shoulder placement. Quarters are strong with good turn of stifle enabling her to move with purpose and precision. Head is good with excellent strength of muzzle. Correct eye shape with kind alert outlook. Wide underjaw, would like a better lip placement. In the last few for the CC.

2nd - Miller's Walkon Bunny Girl - Quality feminine dark B/W with a clean cut outline that demands attention. Long crested neck, evident forechest with good spring of rib. Clean head with good rise, excellent pigmentation, good mouth. Moved and showed very well just preferred strength of muzzle on 1.

3rd - Beardsell & Van-Beck's Newlaithe Just Stunning

NB 10 (2 abs)

1st - Drinkwater's Sulez Caprice - Very stylish B/W. Lovely head with balance of muzzle to skull. Dark expressive eyes, good mouth, lovely reach of neck, which flows into good shoulders. Correct depth of brisket. Firm topline with good tailset. Presents a very attractive picture when posed and retains her shape well on the move.

2nd - Huckerby & Higg's Norwilbeck Angel Dust - B/W just out of puppy. Taller on leg than 1st needing to drop a little in brisket but after saying that a promising youngster of style and quality. Arched neck, good topline and angulations. Head is well balanced of good type. Very alert outlook. Moved well.

3rd - Morrison's Xandene Moulin Rouge

DB 12 (3abs)

1st - Huckerby's Norwilbeck Star Struck - I really liked her feminine style and elegance. Super outline good foreleg height and layback of shoulder with an excellent reach of neck. Good topline and tailset. Quarters developing well. Balanced head with strength of muzzle and finish of fore face. Handled to advantage. Moved well.

2nd - Mair's Stravogan Special Design for Glenauld - Another B/W of 13 mths with lots of style and quality and many of the above comments apply. Slightly more mature in body properties than 1 but head not as finished in muzzle and foreface. A very close decision between two lovely young bitches.

3rd - Carnaby's Tartarian Star Dust.

GB 11 (1 abs)

1st - Phelp's Sleipnir Viking Goddess - Feminine B/W with a head of excellent proportions. Wide well padded muzzle with good depth and lovely sweep of underjaw giving an excellent lip placement. Clean cut outline with long strong neck. Good topline and tailset. Quarters are well muscled with correct angulation. Covered the ground well.

2nd - Box & Turner's Boxken Magic Dust - B/W with an attractive body shape and clean flowing lines. Excellent front assembly with good length of neck. Strong bone but she has a feminine outlook. Good head with balance of muzzle to skull ratio. Lovely eye shape. Moved and showed well.

3rd - Miller's Walkon Aint No Saint

PG 15 (4 abs)

1st - Laidlaw's Alcomer Oak Smoked with Roamaro - Very well balanced neat B/W with good round bone and tight feet. Excellent forechest, depth of brisket and tuck up. Strong well developed quarters. Presented a very classy outline. Head is well balanced with no exaggerations. Moved with precision and drive, the best mover of the day. Last few for the CC.

2nd - Cook's Manic Chatline - I have always admired the style and quality of this bitch. She was very close up to 1 and has many of the same qualities both in body and head type, what tipped the scales in favour of Oak Smoked was her great movement.

3rd - Jordan's Sunvally Silk & Steel

LB 15 (3abs)

1st - Pynegar's Berwynfa Alltorque at Cascorike - Tall upstanding B/W with a sharp outline. Long crested neck, good front assembly and forechest. Firm topline with clean undersweep. Good turn of stifle, tight cat like feet. Head is balanced with dark well shaped eyes. Shown & handled well. Last few for CC.

2nd - Norman & Butter's Bostra Hearsay at Bohan - Feminine B/W with a lovely head and expression. Strong wide muzzle with balanced depth. Wide mouth with correct lip placement. Clean strong neck of good length. Presents a square outline with good rib cage and tuck up. Not as positive in topline on the move as 1.

3rd - Pye's Burnden playing the Game

OB 5 (1abs)

1st - Drinkwater's Sulez Black Magic - What a pleasure it was to go over this beautiful bitch. She is so well put together. Excellent bone and substance but still retaining her elegance. Really good forehand, strong clean neck. Presents excellent flowing lines. Good turn of stifle with strong quarters and well let down hocks. I know she is a really good mover but today she was rather sluggish, however she was having a false pregnancy and was not psychologically very happy. Res CC.

2nd - Hambleton's Marbleton Vanity Fair - R/W with a lovely head, clean skull, good stop and blocky muzzle. Dark well shaped eyes with an alert outlook. Her body shape is very balanced with a short back. Good topline and tailset. She was very excitable today and did not stand still for very long but her virtues are undeniable.

3rd - Huckerby's Ch Norwilbeck Bed of Roses

VB 5 (2abs)

1st - Rushton's Walkon Frangipani to Davnette - B/W of almost 9 yrs and showing with verve and sparkle maintaining a clean youthful outline with no sign of coarseness of body or head. Moved very well with drive and enthusiasm. A credit to her owners.

2nd - Weall's Janbeau Puddled Again - B/W of 7 yrs who did some useful winning as a youngster and I could see why. She has all the essentials of a quality bitch. Not as clean in outline as 1.

3rd - Brook's Just Luv Lea for Jinnybrux
